# POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP: ADVANCED TRAINING IN SELF-MANAGEMENT INTERVENTIONS FOR SERIOUS CHRONIC CONDITIONS

## GOALS OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM

Indiana University School of Nursing (IUSON) has a long history of providing high quality, interdisciplinary research training. Through this training, fellows will be prepared to:

- 1) develop and apply conceptual and theoretical frameworks to guide research on, and development of, self-management interventions to prevent and manage serious chronic conditions;
- 2) conduct research using innovative designs, rigorous methods, and sophisticated analytics to advance the science of self-management;
- 3) become leaders of interdisciplinary science teams and advocates of research and health policy to improve self-management and reduce the burden of serious chronic conditions.

## CONTACT INFORMATION

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Indiana University School of Nursing offers postdoctoral fellowships for PhD-prepared nurses who wish to obtain additional research training to advance their career as a nurse scientist in areas related to self-management interventions for serious chronic conditions. Fellows will work with experienced nurse scientists who conduct high impact research and lead interdisciplinary research teams to develop and test innovative self-management interventions to prevent or manage serious chronic conditions. They will also have the opportunity to work with senior faculty from a variety of disciplines at Indiana University, Purdue University, and University of Notre Dame - all participating members of the Indiana Clinical Translation Science Institute (Indiana CTSI). Fellows will complete courses, seminars, and journal clubs that are tailored to their individual learning and research career development needs. The postdoctoral training program provides one to two years of intensive research training that prepares the candidate to conduct original research and lead interdisciplinary teams. Start date is flexible. Minority applicants are especially encouraged.

## QUALIFIED APPLICANTS WILL:

- Have earned, or will complete prior to the postdoctoral appointment, a PhD in Nursing from a nationally accredited school of nursing;
- Have an active license as a professional nurse in a state, territory or commonwealth of the United States or the District of Columbia;
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States; and
- Have a competitive academic record, past research, publications, commitment to independent research, and match with research interests of faculty

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE:

- A completed application form;
- Official transcript of graduate study;
- Two letters of recommendation including one from the dissertation chairperson;
- Curriculum vitae or NIH biosketch;
- Abstract and final chapter of the dissertation;
- Letter of support from the postdoctoral mentor; and
- An in-person interview.
