Highlights from the 25th Annual Conference

Psychiatric Mental Health Nurses Rock! The 26th Annual Conference, *Psychiatric Mental Health Nurses: The Power of Leading, Connecting, and Healing*, was a testament to the dedication and passion of over 150 participants, including six international members. The energetic atmosphere fostered a sense of community and healing, making each participant an integral part of this amazing conference. The Conference was not just a gathering, but a platform that significantly contributed to the professional growth of each participant, highlighting their importance in the field.

The event kicked off with a pre-conference workshop Psychiatric Mental Health Nurses: The Power of Understanding and Leading Holistic Care for Individuals Diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder, headed by Lauren Frederick, MA, BCBA, Anne Kearney, MSN, CRNP, PMHNP-BC, Jessica McCurry, MSN, APRN, PMHNP-BC, and Elizabeth Steinmiller, MSN, PMHCNS-**BC**. In addition, the four featured speakers were not just inspiring, but their contributions were invaluable. They delivered excellent presentations on critical issues facing psychiatric mental health nurses today, leaving the audience inspired and eager to implement the knowledge gained. 

Management of Dual/Co-Occurring Diagnoses – Opportunities for Interdisciplinary Collaboration

Knowledge in the management of dual substance use-mental health problems (cooccurring disorders) is critical for both psychiatric-mental health nurses and nurses of other specialties. Among individuals with a substance use disorder, approximately 40% have a mental health diagnosis, and among individuals with a mental health diagnosis, approximately one in five have a substance use disorder (Han et al., 2017; NIDA, 2024). There is increasing evidence that patient outcomes are improved when co-occurring disorders are addressed simultaneously. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has recently reaffirmed the importance of the identification and management of co-occurring disorders, and has released a Treatment Improvement Protocol -- <u>Substance Use Disorder Treatment for Persons with Co-Occurring Disorders: A Treatment Improvement Protocol (TIP Series, No. 42)</u>.

I have recently had the opportunity to serve as an ISPN Liaison to the International Nurses Society on Addictions (IntNSA) and represented ISPN at the recent IntNSA Conference in Charleston, South Carolina, earlier this year. ISPN and IntNSA share similar goals as it relates to advancing nursing practice and improving patient outcomes across the globe, and we look forward to future collaboration with IntNSA. In fact, IntNSA and ISPN are partnering on a position statement related to the management of co-occurring disorders, and any ISPN members interested in working on this statement should reach out to me at <u>Bnk13@pitt.edu</u>.

I would like to extend my sincerest appreciation to Dana Murphy-Parker, current IntNSA President, who graciously invited ISPN to have a representative at their annual conference, and who has welcomed opportunities for collaboration between these two important organizations.
